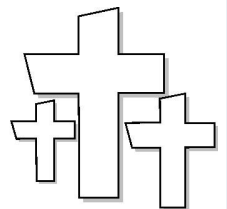

Languages

At Deepcar St John's CofE Junior School, we believe that the study of languages prepares pupils to participate in a rapidly changing world.

The process of learning a foreign language reinforces fluency and understanding of grammar, sentence structure and accurate pronunciation. We aim for pupils to leave school with the skills to be effective users of basic French language showing an understanding and respect of different cultures in our local, national and global communities.

All children are taught French by their class teacher once a week. We follow the ilangauges scheme of work throughout school supplemented by resources and units from the KaPOW schime of work. We buildion skills learnt each year focusing on the national curriculum objectives to:

- ◆ Read fluently
- ◆ Write imaginatively
- ◆ Speak confidently
- ◆ Understand the culture of the countries where the language is spoken.

Lower Key Stage 2

All units cover grammar, speaking and listening, reading and writing. The main focus is on speaking and listening, then progressing onto reading, alongside spoken language and then finally writing. Through the units, key words and phrases are revisited and used through all the year groups. We begin with a focus on single words and pronunciation, then progressing onto phrases, simple sentences and then finally onto longer and more complex sentences.

Main topics in Y3/4 include:

- Greetings
- In the classroom
- Animals
- Numbers to 30
- Colours
- Opinions
- Who are you? Describing people
- Going shopping (food)
- Using a bilingual dictionary

Upper Key Stage 2

In Y5/6, children increase their skills in using bilingual dictionaries and begin to learn how to conjugate verbs. Sentences increase in complexity.

Main topics in Y5/6 include:

- Hobbies
- Clothes
- Numbers 30-100
- Verbs: avoir, être and aller (to have, to be, to go)
- School
- Daily routine/time
- Houses
- Directions/around town
- Where is French spoken around the world?
