Y4 Educational Visit to Creswell Crags

Dear Parents/Carers,

As part of our topic in the Spring term 'Stone Age', we have arranged an educational visit to Creswell Crags in Derbyshire. This amazing limestone gorge was once home to Ice Age animals and Stone Age hunters. During the visit, the children will explore one of the caves in Creswell Crags to hear stories of survival in the Stone Age. They will experience what it took to survive as a Stone Age person and start to understand what art meant to the very first artists by becoming a prehistoric painter.

The trip will take place on **Thursday 1st February 2024**. The children will need to **arrive at school for 8.30am** to be registered by their class teacher and the coach will **return at 3.45pm**. Children should come to school wearing school uniform.

Children will need to bring a packed lunch with them and a water bottle. If your child is entitled to a free school meal and would like to order a packed lunch, then please notify the school office.

The **cost of the trip is £21** which includes the coach fare and three activities during the day: Stone Age Cave Story, Survival Skills workshop and Art of the Ancients workshop.
